








Suggested Summer Reading from the Kingston Public Library

<p>Sports Drama</p> 	<p><u>Left Out by Tim Green</u> All Landon Dorch has ever wanted is to be like everyone else. His deafness and the way he talks have been obstacles all his life. But now he finally sees his chance to fit in. Bigger and taller than any other seventh grader in his new school, Landon plans to use his size to his advantage and join the school's football team. But the same speech problems and the cochlear implants that help him hear continue to haunt him.</p>
<p>Humor/Graphic Novel</p> 	<p><u>Dog Man by Dave Pilkey</u> George and Harold have created a new hero who digs into deception, claws after crooks, and rolls over robbers. <p>Humor/Graphic Novel</p>		<p><u>Ghosts by Raina Telgemeier</u> Catrina and her family have moved to the coast of Northern California for the sake of her little sister, Maya, who has cystic fibrosis--and Cat is even less happy about the move when she is told that her new town is inhabited by ghosts, and Maya sets her heart on meeting one.</p>
<p>Adventure/Sequel</p>		<p><u>The Candymakers and the Great Chocolate Chase by Wendy Mass</u> When the Candymaker announces that they will be going on tour to introduce the new candy bar, the four friends see this as an opportunity to make things right. But with a fifty-year-old secret revealed and stakes higher for each of them than they ever imagined, they will have to trust one another--and themselves--in order to face what lies ahead.</p>

<p>Humor/Family</p>		<p><u>The Lottery Plus One by Emma Donoghue</u> Once upon a time, two couples with Jamaican, Mohawk, Indian, and Scottish ethnic roots won the lottery and bought a big house where all of them, four adults and seven adopted and biological children, could live together in harmony--but change is inevitable, especially when a disagreeable grandfather comes to stay.</p>
